Case Vignette

- 45 Y/O gentleman, Administrative Officer, with left leg swelling and pain since last week
- SH: No regular exercise, smoker (20ys, 5PPD)
- PMH & DH: unremarkable
- Ph. Exam.: BP=115/75 mmHg,
 - Heart & Lungs: unremarkable
 - Extremity: 2⁺ symmetrical pulses, 4cm difference in the leg circumference (left>right)
- DUS:
 - Right: compressible proximal veins with normal spontaneous flow and phasicity, compressible distal veins
 - Left: non-compressible femoral vein at mid thigh and popliteal vein with visible thrombosis
