Case Vignette

- 45 Y/O gentleman, Administrative Officer, with left leg swelling and pain since last week
- SH: No regular exercise, smoker (20ys, 5PPD)
- PMH & DH: unremarkable
- Ph. Exam.: BP=115/75 mmHg,
 - Heart & Lung: unremarkable
 - Extremity: 2+ symmetrical pulse, 4cm difference in leg circumference (left>right)

O DUS:

- Right: compressible proximal veins with normal spontaneous flow and phasicity, compressible distal vein
- Left: non-compressible femoral vein at mid thigh and popliteal vein with visible thrombosis
