Case Vignette

- 23 Y/O gentleman, with recent-onset fever, night sweats, muscle aches and worsening dyspnea in the recent days
- PMH: unremarkable
- **DH**: unremarkable
- **Ph. Exam.**: BP=105/65 mmHg, Sat 0₂: 96%
 - Heart: Tachycardia, holodiastolic murmur
 - Lung: clear
- ECG: NSR, Sinus Tachycardia (120_{bpm})
- Echo:
 - Hyperdynamic Heart, EF=60%, Bicuspid AV, small mass on both AV leaflets, moderate eccentric AI
